Mapping Activity and Discussion Questions





Instructions

During this activity, your table(s) will be reviewing several maps of North or South Carolina. These maps include county-level data depicting the following data points: diabetes prevalence, race, poverty, and food insecurity. As you progress through the activity, each map will include an additional data point as an overlay. For example, the first map will include diabetes prevalence only, then the second map will include diabetes prevalence and race, and so on.

As a group, you will discuss the trends you notice at each level, making note of how these data points may intersect with one another. Please utilize the discussion questions below to help guide your conversations. You can elect one person at your table to lead the discussion and take notes on your conversations. Please be prepared to report out for 1-2 minutes on the highlights from your table's discussion.

Members of the data team will be walking around during the activity to answer any questions you may have.
